## Your Impact

### **\$0.50 a week provides one of the following:**

- Provides one person with batteries for their hearing aides through Catalyst Life Services

### **\$3 a week provides one of the following:**

- Gives a girl the chance to experience camp through the Girl Scouts
- Provides a free hearing test to a person in need

### **\$5 a week provides one of the following:**

- Gives a girl an entire year of Girl Scout Programming

### **\$8 a week provides one of the following:**

- Provides a person with disabilities, resume writing and interview prep assistance from a trained vocational professional

- Provides a complete after school program with Mid-Ohio Youth Mentoring, Inc. for a year

### **\$20 a week provides one of the following:**

- Gives five girls the opportunity to experience overnight camp
- Provides one child with Mid-Ohio Youth Mentoring, Inc. for a year

## United Impact

- CACY provided **1,500** hours of service to over **5,000** students from local schools for drug and alcohol prevention
- Third Street Family Health Services had over **90,000** total patient visits
- **280** children were able to attend Happy Hollow Day Camp at the Friendly House
- Catalyst Life Services provided over **6,000** hours of clinical counseling for mental health and substance abuse
- Harmony House provided meal and lodging to over **600** unique clients
- The Friendly House served a total of **15,000** meals to children during their in school and afterschool programs
- The Big Red Bookshelf Project at United Way distributed over **6,000** books throughout the community
- Over **80** children were served with rich, educational programming from the community and a nutritious meal this summer
- Summer of Caring had a total of **12** businesses from various sectors in the community participate and serve **eight** nonprofits with a total of over **75** volunteers participating



## Community Initiative

### **Big Red Bookshelf Project**

The Big Red Bookshelf Project provides new or gently used books for children birth through third grade at locations in Richland County where young children visit with their families. The books, which are donated by community members, can be found on brightly painted red bookshelves built by local volunteers.
